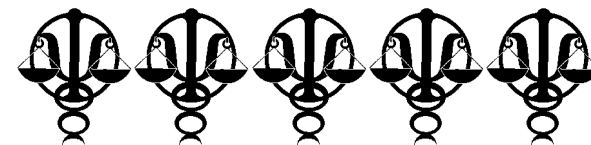
Reservations cannot be taken without payment. A refund less \$15 processing fee will only be available if booking is cancelled by 5pm on Friday 5 September.

THE SPEAKER: Dr Robert (Bob) Adler

Bob Adler graduated from the University of Sydney in 1969 and completed his training in psychiatry and child psychiatry at the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital and the Royal Alexandra Hospital for Children in Sydney.

Between 1977 and 1984 he held appointments as a Staff Psychiatrist in the Department of Child and Family Psychiatry at RAHC and then as Senior Lecturer in Child Psychiatry in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Newcastle, where he completed his PhD.

He was Chairman of the Royal Children's Hospital, Mental Health Service, and Professor/Director of Child and Family Psychiatry in the Departments of Paediatrics and Psychiatry at the University of Melbourne from 1985 to 1998.

He is currently a psychiatrist at the Adolescent Forensic Health Service at the Melbourne Juvenile Justice Centre, President of the Medical Practitioners Board of Victoria, and has a part-time private practice with an interest in the forensic aspects of child and adolescent psychiatry, particularly in relation to child protection and child welfare in both the Family Court and Children's Courts.

VENUE FOR THIS DINNER MEETING:

THE KELVIN CLUB Melbourne Place, Melbourne

The Kelvin Club is located on Melbourne Place, a laneway opposite the Russell Street cinema complex.

"The Kelvin Club was established in 1927, from the former Fitzroy East Melbourne Bowling Club, itself founded in 1865. The founding membership decided to name the new club after Lord Kelvin, a British physicist, in admiration of his pioneering work. The club acquired its present premises in Melbourne Place in 1945. The topography of the stately surrounds is a cacophony of antique to modern. Once you enter, you straddle an epoch that is curiously old and new. Grace and charm abound, from an inviting chesterfield to the pleasant aroma of a Montecristo Churchill. It is with delight to say there are not many places like Kelvin that remain today. Slightly 'Yes Minister' and overtly Victorian in a Melbourne manner, Kelvin is like stepping into a 'Doctor Who' reality that will take you to places, people and times that few buildings in this town can. A place to rethink, revisit and revive, far from the madding crowds. The Kelvin Club is a memorable experience, a sanctum for which there is no comparison."
